D. Biblical examples

- James
 - Quickly takes charge in leaderless (or multiple-leader) situations—Acts 15:13-21.
 - Readily recognized by others as a leader—Acts 12:17, 21:18; Galatians 2:9.
 - Challenges others with his and with biblical authority—the book of James has more than 50 direct commands. In 108 verses, James refers or alludes to 22 Old Testament books and 15 topics from Jesus' Sermon on the Mount.
